


Chaplain's Corner

NAS Jacksonville Base Access

You must have a valid Military ID and a valid driving license to drive on base, with proof of insurance and a valid vehicle registration regardless of the state their vehicle is registered in.. All passengers must be able to present a valid US photo identification. Decals are no longer required on vehicles. Motorcycle operators must have motorcycle endorsement on their Driver's license.

If you have Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) from the VA and it has "Service Connected" under your name, you can get on the NAS JAX with that. The VHIC must display the veteran's eligibility status. All VHIC cardholders MUST stop at the NAS Jax Visitor Control Center (VCC) to enroll in the Defense Biometric Identification System (DBIDS) before entering NAS JAX the first time. The VCC is located in Building 9 before the NAS Jax Main Gate on the right.

If you do not have a valid ID, you can be sponsored by someone who does, and you must ride with that person (you do not have driving privileges on base without a Military ID and the sponsor is responsible for that person at all times). We urge you to find a friend who you can ride with or meet at the gate and park in the back side of the B-9 parking lot.



An alternative option is to fill out Form 5512/1. Fill out this form and send it back with your memorial registration. This form and the registration MUST be returned no later than **September 15, 2024**.

This form is a request to gain access to the base for a one-time event – the Reunion - for that day (**October 12, 2024**) and is only valid for that day - you will not be able to stay overnight on base. This form must be filled out fully and correctly, do not leave any information blank. Incomplete forms will not be processed, and you will need to find alternative access. You will need to check in at Base Security and meet with the NMCB 14 Association Representative to pick up your preprinted pass. The representative will only be available from 08:00 to 12:00 to hand out the pass. It is your responsibility to be on time.

ID Card Scanning - All Military Installations have begun scanning ID cards for Base access. If you currently hold an older ID with the SSN printed on the face of the card, it may not scan properly and will be confiscated. Renewal of the ID will then be required.

NSA Souda Bay Remembers the Seven

NAVAL SUPPORT ACTIVITY SOUDA BAY, Greece (May 2, 2024)

Naval Support Activity Souda Bay and Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) Europe Africa Central (EURAFCENT) service members and personnel held a memorial service for Naval Mobile Construction Battalion (NMCB) 14 at The Anchor on May 2, 2024.

"Our ceremony today is to stop, pause, and honor our Seabees who lost their lives, so we all can live in a country with the freedom we all cherish,"

said Utilitiesman 2nd Class Brian Torres, NAVFAC EURAFCENT. "Today, we remember Seabees who lived by our core values of honor, courage, and commitment. We stop for a few moments, so we always remember the enormous price our brothers and their families have paid so we – and all Americans – can enjoy the freedom we have been given."

The ceremony memorialized seven NMCB-14 Sailors who paid the ultimate sacrifice and 35 who were wounded in 2004 while the battalion was serving in Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Throughout Iraq and Afghanistan, Seabees built bridges, conducted convoy operations, and built forward-operating bases alongside Marines, embodying their motto of "We Build, We Fight."



"There is a difference between being ready and being prepared," said retired Senior Chief Construction Mechanic Francisco Landrau, event coordinator for the ceremony. "We were ready, but nothing can prepare you for the horrors of war. We coped and made sense of reality by shrugging it all off, and all the other close calls by laughing and commenting to each other, 'it was just not our time, not our day.' This was our war, and that was my fight. I retired and no longer wear the uniform. Today our battlefield and the face of our enemy has changed and continues to evolve. We all have our Mission – master yours – and never forget our fallen."

NMCB-14 made history as the first reserve battalion to assume command from an active-duty battalion since WW2.

"It is important to make time, like today, to step back and remember why we wear this uniform those that have built our legacy, and reflect on what we will do to carry that legacy forward," said Lt. Cmdr. Matthew Riege, public works officer, NSA Souda Bay. "I have one ask for everyone here today: we figure out what each one of us will do to carry forward the legacy and carry on for these seven Seabees."

Seabees from the NAVFAC EURAFCENT laid a wreath as the master of ceremonies read the names of the fallen Sailors:

- Hull Maintenance Technician 2nd Class Jason Dwelley, April 30, 2004, Iraq
- Equipment Operator 3rd Class Christopher Dickerson, April 30, 2004, Iraq
- Builder 2nd Class Michael Anderson, May 2, 2004, Iraq
- Steelworker 3rd Class Ronald Ginther, May 2, 2004, Iraq
- Builder 2nd Class Robert Jenkins, May 2, 2004, Iraq
- Construction Mechanic 2nd Class Scott McHugh, May 2, 2004, Iraq
- Equipment Operator 2nd Class Trace Dossett, May 2, 2004, Iraq

"The desert sand has been anointed with the blood of those seven Seabees who volunteered to serve and understood that one day, their service to our nation may cost them their lives," concluded Landrau. "It should be important to all of us to memorialize our fallen, so that we can assure, that as time passes, their sacrifices will not have been in vain."



NMCB 14 ASSOCIATION

During the 2003-2004 Iraqi Freedom deployment of NMCB 14, seven of its Seabees were killed and 34 wounded. In 2004, a Purple Heart Ceremony was held at NAS Jacksonville, Florida where NMCB 14 has its headquarters. It was well-attended by the military community, as well as retired and former members of NMCB 14. As a result of this gathering, **Capt. Bob Brockway** organized a small group of key retired officers and enlisted personnel to form an alumni association with a primary mission of aiding the families of those NMCB 14 personnel who were killed or wounded during Iraqi Freedom and any future conflict casualties.

On March 12, 2005, a meeting of the organizing committee was held at the Best Western Hotel & Suites in Orange Park, Florida. Those in attendance were **Jack Araneo**, **Bob Brockway**, **Randy Bushey**, **Ron Helton**, **Al Kenny**, **Bill Purkis**, **Joe Schweigart**, **Bill Tydings**, and **Mike Wood**. **Neil Orange**, who also was part of the organizing committee, was not able to attend. An organization was set up and interim appointments were made to the Executive Committee (Board of Directors and Officers). The initial purpose of the Association was in keeping with the following goals:

- 1. Camaraderie within the Seabee community, inclusive of all Navy rates, ranks, and designators.
- 2. Support of the inclusive Seabee community.
- 3. Communications with members.
- 4. Historical restoration and preservation.

By-laws were established and a nonprofit status was applied for. In November 2007 the nonprofit status was granted. The association was then a 501 (c) (19) military nonprofit organization.
